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



Project Aims


- Global Aim: To improve rates of COVID-19 vaccination among patients receiving primary care at Epsom Family Medicine
 - <u>Specific Aim #1</u> → To increase the percentage of Epsom patients with accurate documentation of COVID-19 immunization status in the EMR from ~26% to >75% by June 30, 2022
 - Specific Aim #2 → To increase the percentage of eligible Epsom patients who are fully vaccinated for COVID-19 from an estimated 60% to at least 80% by June 30, 2022




Question #4: What are your most trusted sources of information regarding COVID-19 and vaccines?






How many Epsom Family Medicine patients are <u>up</u> <u>to date</u> with COVID-19 vaccinations?



How many Epsom Family Medicine patients admitted to Concord Hospital for COVID-19 received care in the <u>Intensive Care Unit</u>?




How many Epsom Family Medicine patients admitted to Concord Hospital for COVID-19 <u>died</u> while in the hospital?


Fall COVID-19 Vaccine Event... Reality


- What was intended to be an educational event with the option to get a vaccine turned into a de facto vaccine clinic with a side of education...
 - 25 doses of Pfizer Bivalent COVID-19 Booster administered
 - •16 flu shots (10 high dose)

• 41 vaccines in 3 hours!

*Note: For flu clinics, we typically schedule 1 patient every 10 minutes \rightarrow 18 vaccines in 3 hours


Attendees By Age Group

At Least 1 Dose of Any COVID-19 Vaccine




Month of Last PCP Office Visit Among Event Attendees

Key Themes from Staff Feedback


Excellent patient turnout and high rates of vaccine administration.

Wait times were long, but most patients were willing to wait.

Patients were extremely grateful.

Staff worked well as a team to deal with the unexpected. Starting the event later may have limited overlap with clinic patients.

Pre-scheduling may have resulted in a smoother clinic. Better staffing may have made the process more efficient.

Key Lessons Learned

- Even though there is a wealth of COVID-19 vaccine available throughout the community, many patients still came to EFM and were willing to wait to get their vaccines
- Patients are open to getting their COVID-19 and influenza vaccines at the same time most event attendees received both vaccines!
- There seems to be a role for communication via mail with primary care patients – many of the patients who attended this event had not been in clinic during the period where we were actively advertising this event and could only have learned about it via mail
- We need to work harder to engage pediatric patients all event participants were ≥ 50 years old and our pediatric population has the lowest rates of vaccination at EFM
- Drop-in events are logistically challenging but have the benefit of being lowbarrier for patients – future events with plans for vaccine administration would benefit from the option to pre-register as well as drop-in

Next Steps

- Maintenance of a COVID-19 vaccine information station in the clinic waiting room, using resources from the 10/18 event
- Ongoing data collection within the clinic using the interactive survey from 10/18
- Refinement and further development of an after-hours COVID-19 vaccine clinic → later start-time, mix of prescheduled and drop-in appointments
- Further engagement of the pediatric population in COVID-19 vaccination efforts
